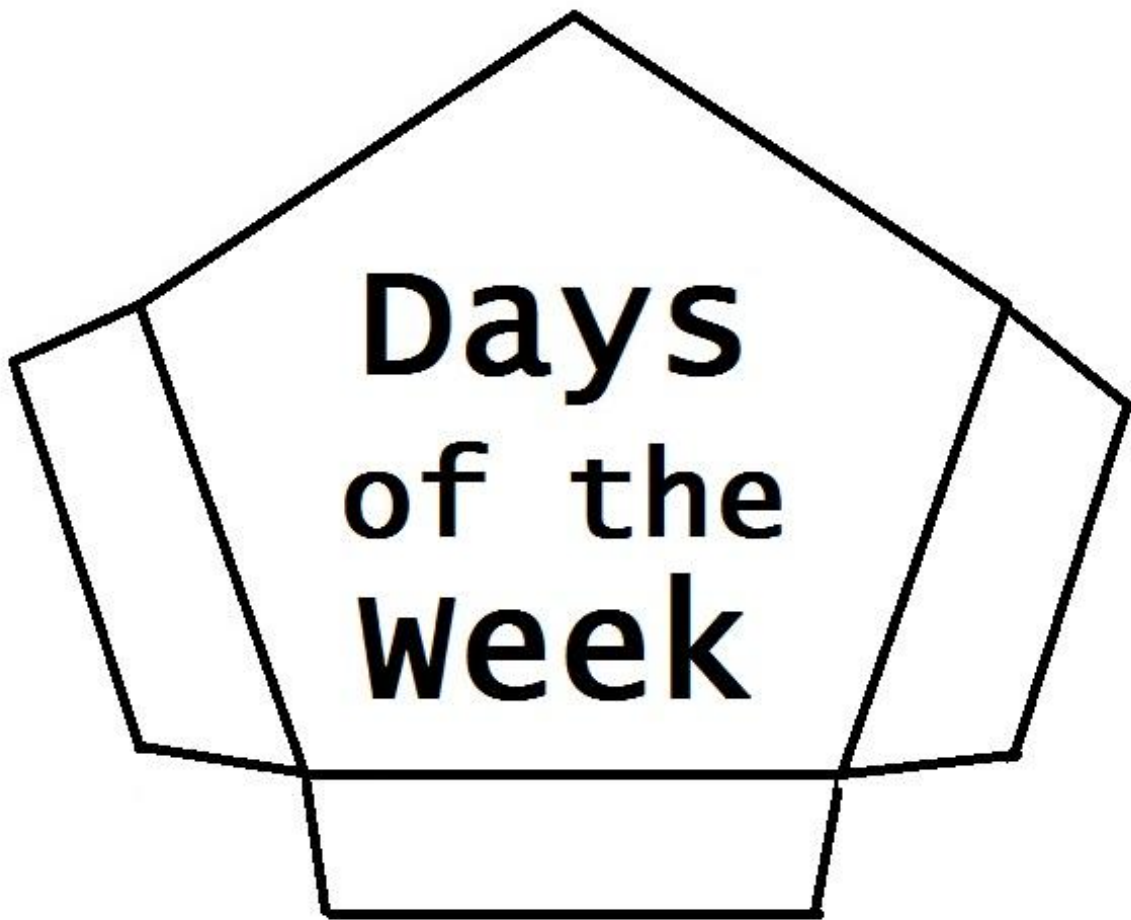
I printed the following pages out on cardstock to make it more durable for my 5 year old.

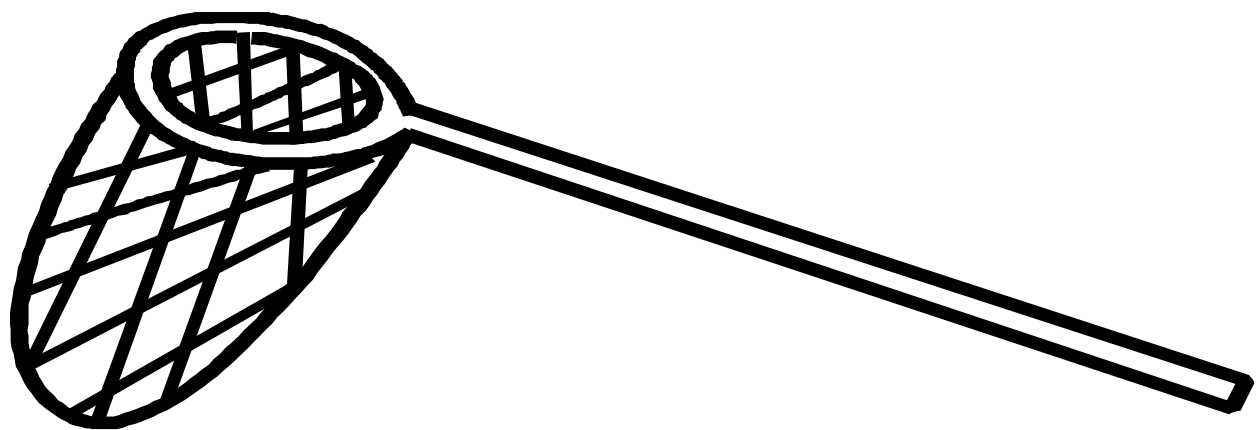
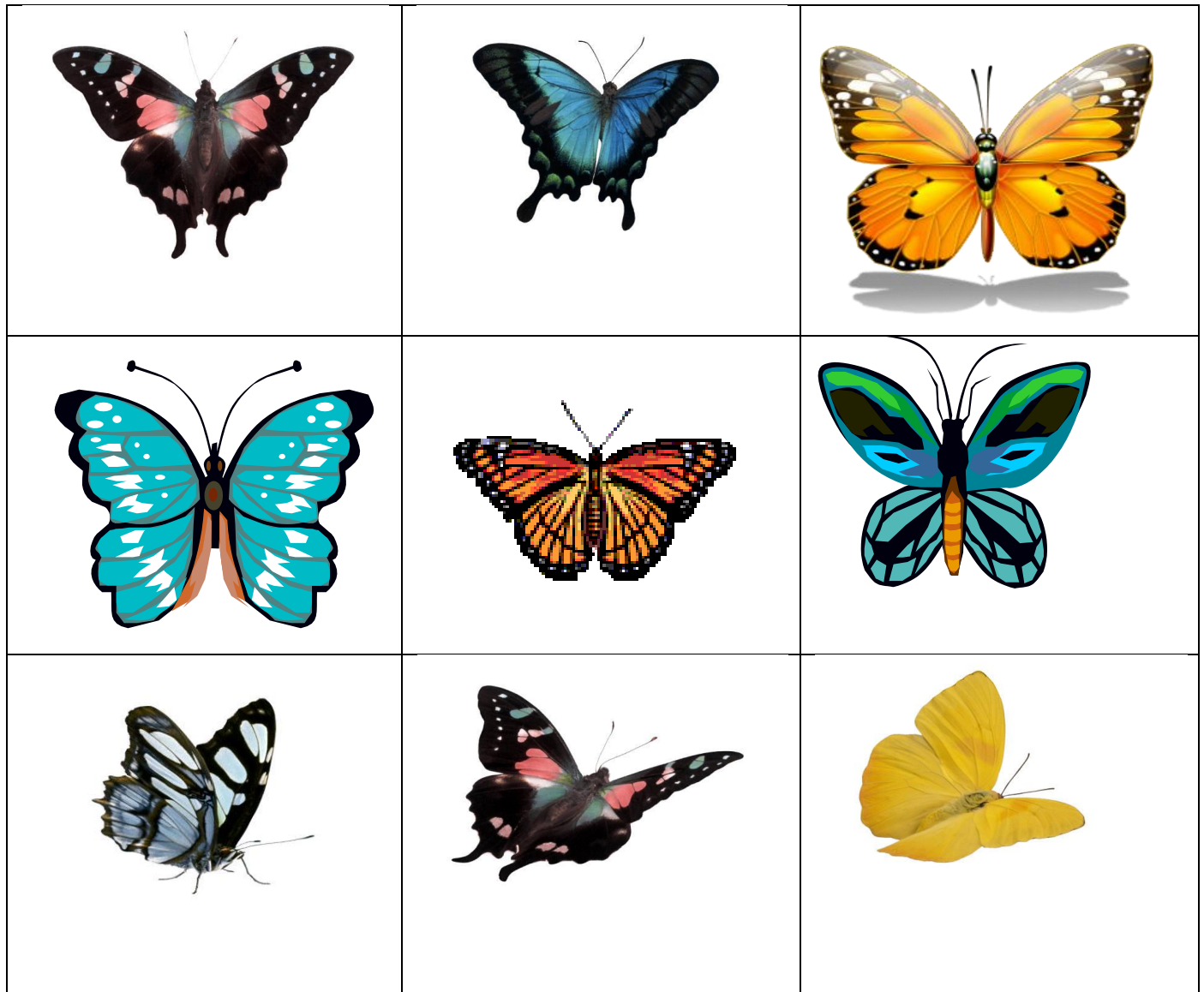

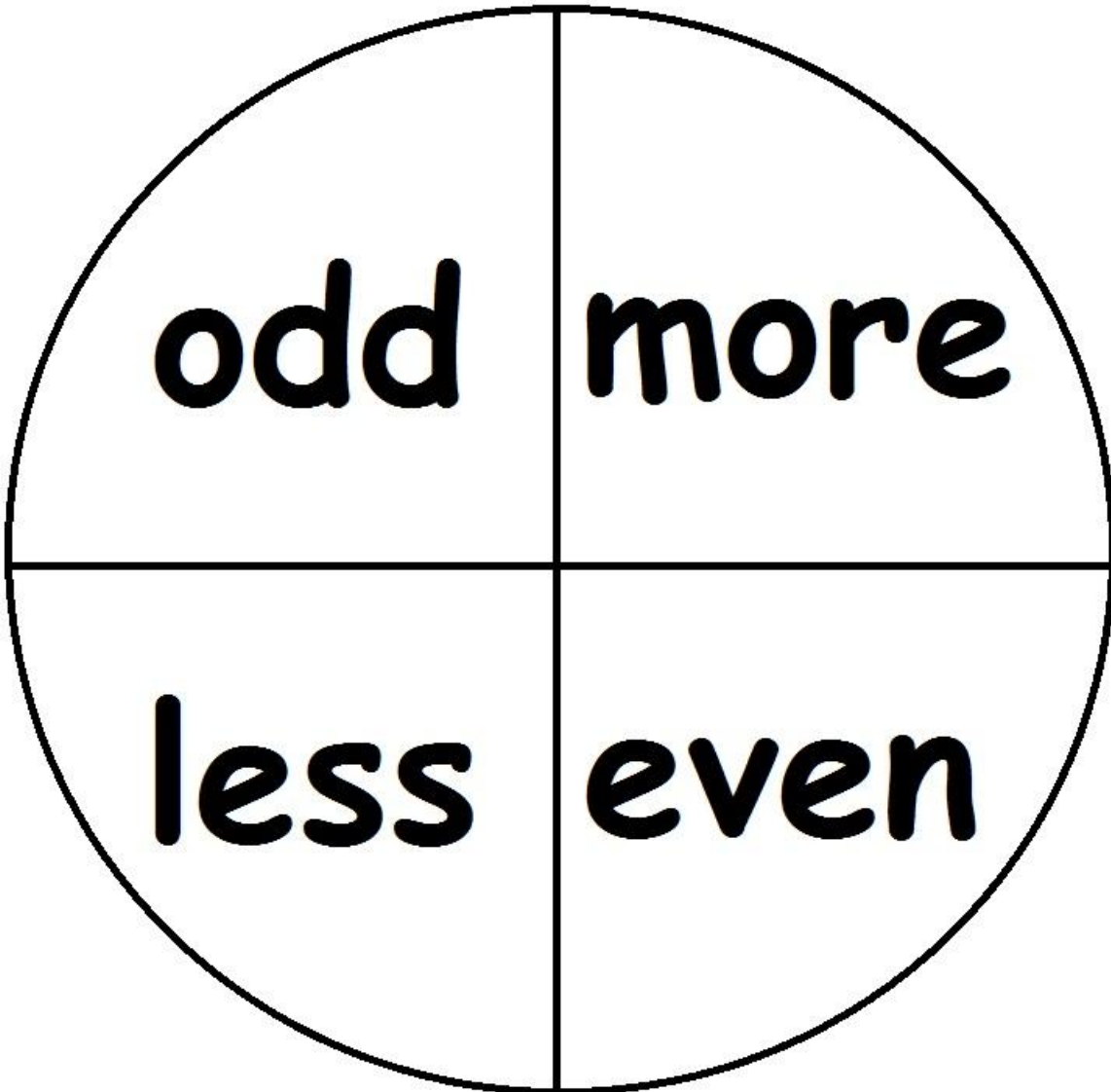
