



Learning about Islam - Answer Sheet

Islam is the faith and way of life for <u>around 1.5 billion</u> people. (21% of the people in the world) People who follow the faith of Islam are known as Muslims.

Islam originated in <u>Saudi Arabia</u> but it is now practiced worldwide.

The highest density of Muslims is in Indonesia.

The Islamic God is called <u>Allah</u>. The <u>Koran or Qur'an</u> is the holy book that Muslims use to guide them in their faith. It was written through a prophet called <u>Muhammad</u>. He is often regarded as the founder of Islam.

The Five Pillars of Islam refer to the essential duties of every faithful Muslim:

- 1. The first is the belief in one God. The Muslim call to prayer repeats this basic belief: "There is no God but Allah, and Muhammad is the prophet of God."
- 2. Prayer: <u>five</u> times a day, faithful Muslims turn to face the holy city of <u>Mecca</u> and pray.
- 3. Giving alms (an act of charity) is the third duty.
- 4. Fasting during the holy month of Ramadan
- 5. Pilgrimage: Muslims are supposed to make a pilgrimage to Mecca at least <u>once</u> during their lives.


1st Row: Christian Cross, Jewish Star of David, Hindu Aumkar
