

Shiva, the Destroyer The 7th and most important avatar (reincarnation) of Vishnu. One of the most loved Hindu gods, often show with dark blue skin and playing a flute.

Preserver of the universe. When humankind needs help, he appears on Earth as an avatar (reincarnation). He is traditionally shown as blue with 4 arms often riding on the mythical bird Garuda.

God who created the universe and set it in motion. He is traditionally shown with 4 heads.

Goddess also named Durga, who is the wife of Shiva. She is fierce and powerful. She is shown with many arms. These are for fighting against demons.

The 6th avatar (reincarnation) of Vishnu and the hero of the eipc, *Ramayana*. He defeated the powerful demon, Ravana. Worshipped for his bravery and goodness.

The elephant-headed son of Shiva and Parvati. He is wise, thoughtful and jolly.

God of both destruction and creation. His destructive powers remove the world's impurities.











Some Hindu beliefs:

reincarnation – Hindus believe that each person has an eternal soul, which is reincarnated or reborn, in a new body after death.

Karma - Karma is the sum of all the good and bad actions performed by the person during past lives.

dharma - Dharma is the set of specific religious and social duties assigned to each person according to his or her place in society.

moksha – A person who fulfills his/her dharma may eventually achieve moksha or liberation. In this state of perfect knowledge and happiness, individuals escape the cycle of death and rebirth and merge with Brahman, the One God.
