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When my girls were 7 and 9 years old, I realized that they needed more practice on learning to read music, learning the corresponding music note on the piano, and learning the basic music notations. I realized that while the kids could play pieces on the piano, they could not read music. So, the plan was to slowly but surely make sure they learned and built on those skills.

We did music two or three times a week, playing games and getting them to recognize the notes more (and more) quickly.

My kids had a basic understanding of music, so we were not starting from zero. You may need to go faster or slower based on the needs of your students. Our plan was to spend about 15 minutes two or three times a week.

This is a HUGE update to the original homeschool music curriculum I laid out for my girls. I added in a whole introductory section that your kids may or may not need. Plus, I added in about 60 pages of music worksheets. Not only that, but I have added in 12 or 15 hands-on games and activities. You will find those in a separate PDF packet.

When the kids were in preschool and early elementary, I introduced them to the xylophone. The semester we did this curriculum, the kids learned pieces on the piano and I taught the kids a bit of recorder that year as well.

By the end of the semester I wanted the kids know about 2 octaves worth of notes on the staff (both treble and bass clefs) and their location on a keyboard/piano. This packet shows how we used these music worksheets and music games each week.

We did not do any music appreciation (learning about famous composers). There were just not enough hours in the day! But we did cover famous composers another time and we have some **free resources** on the website if you want to cover that at some point.

A Note about our Music Materials

This packet includes the general plans I laid out for my elementary-age kids as they learned the notes and note names, the notes on a keyboard and the basic music symbols.

Because Australia, Great Britain, etc. has different names for eighth notes, quarter notes, half and whole notes... (quaver, crotchets, minims, etc.) you will see that at times there are two page options. Print out the page that works best for your student/s.

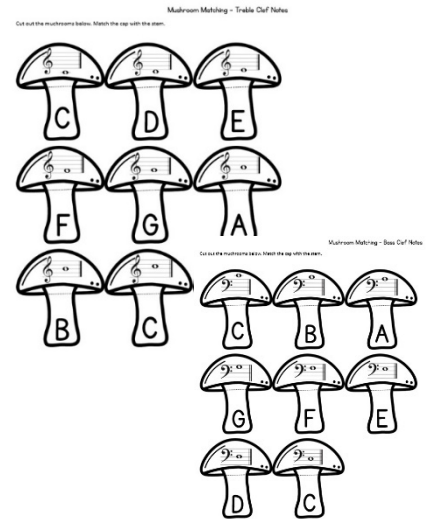
Print out the sunflower keyboard pages on card stock. Cut them out and place them face down. Take turns flipping over one keyboard card and trying to find the matching note.



Mushroom Matching

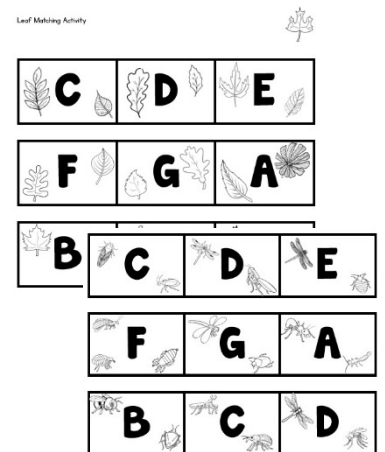

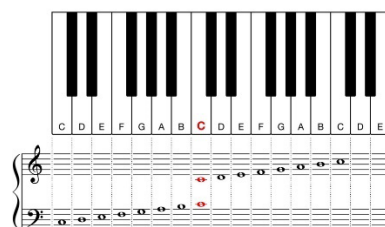
You can choose note names randomly for your students or you can print out the leaf matching or bug letter cards. Have students flip over a card and place the dime or token on the correct space or line.



Piano, Keyboard or Xylophone Practice



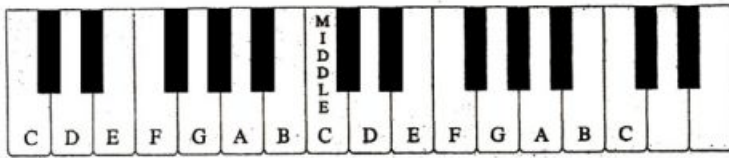

Music Game Instructions

This game helps reinforce the names and number of beats for various notes and rests. It also reviews a few common musical terms.

Print the music game cards and music game board on card stock. Shuffle and place them in a pile face down.

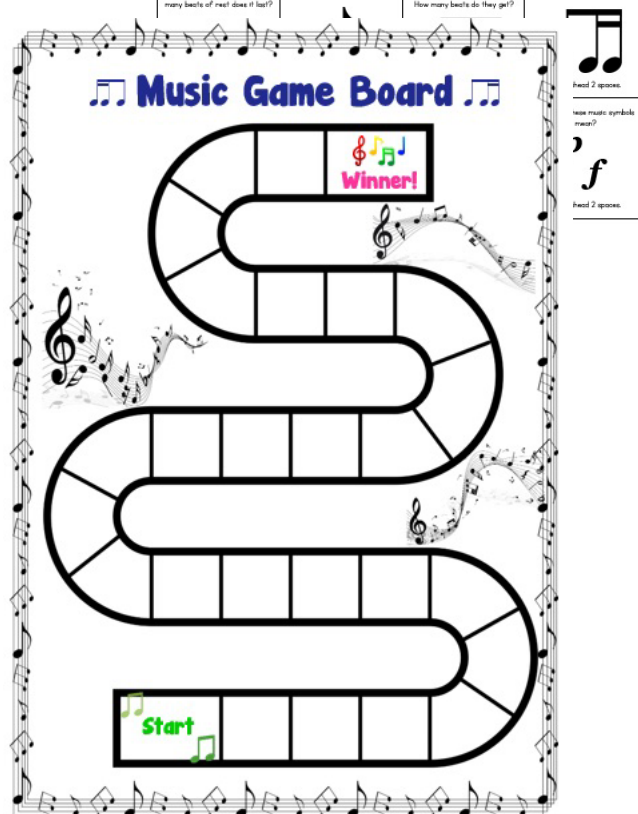
Each player needs a token to move along the game board.

Take turns drawing a card and following the instructions on that card. The first player to make it to the end wins the game!

Bug Swatting Game

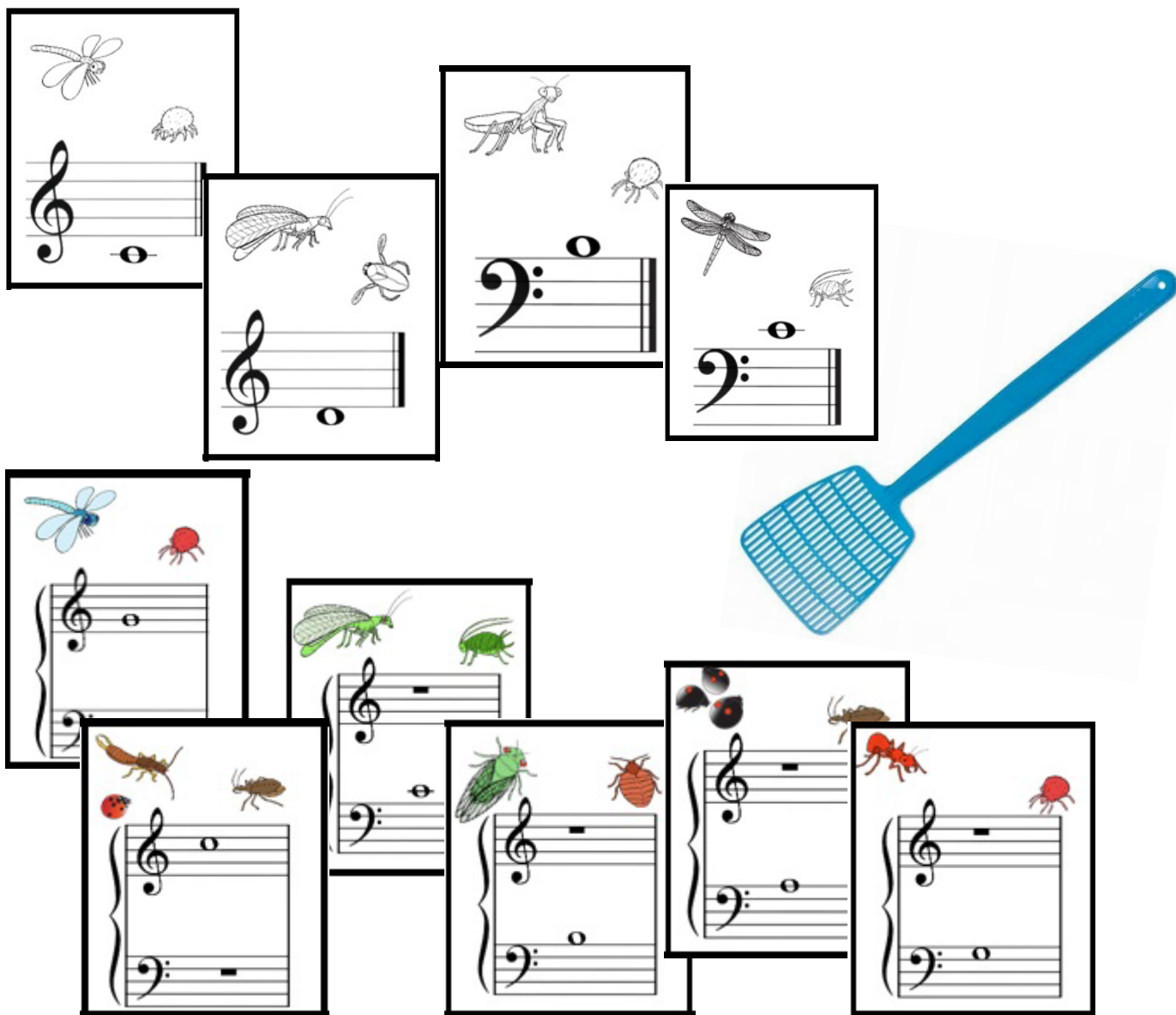
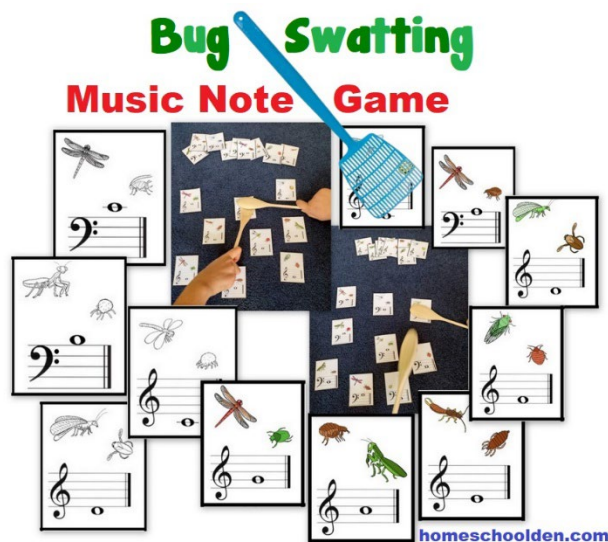
Be the first to swat the correct note!

Place the cards face up in front of the players. Each player will need a fly swatter. Call out a note name - middle C, B or D. The first person to swat a card gets to remove it from the table. Once all the cards are gone, count the cards to see who won the round.

Each week, add in more cards to the game as they learn new notes.

This activity is in the **Music Activity Packet**. These cards are available in black and white - treble clef and bass clef. There are also grand staff notes.

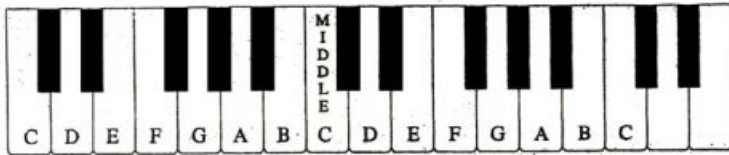

Apple Bingo Game

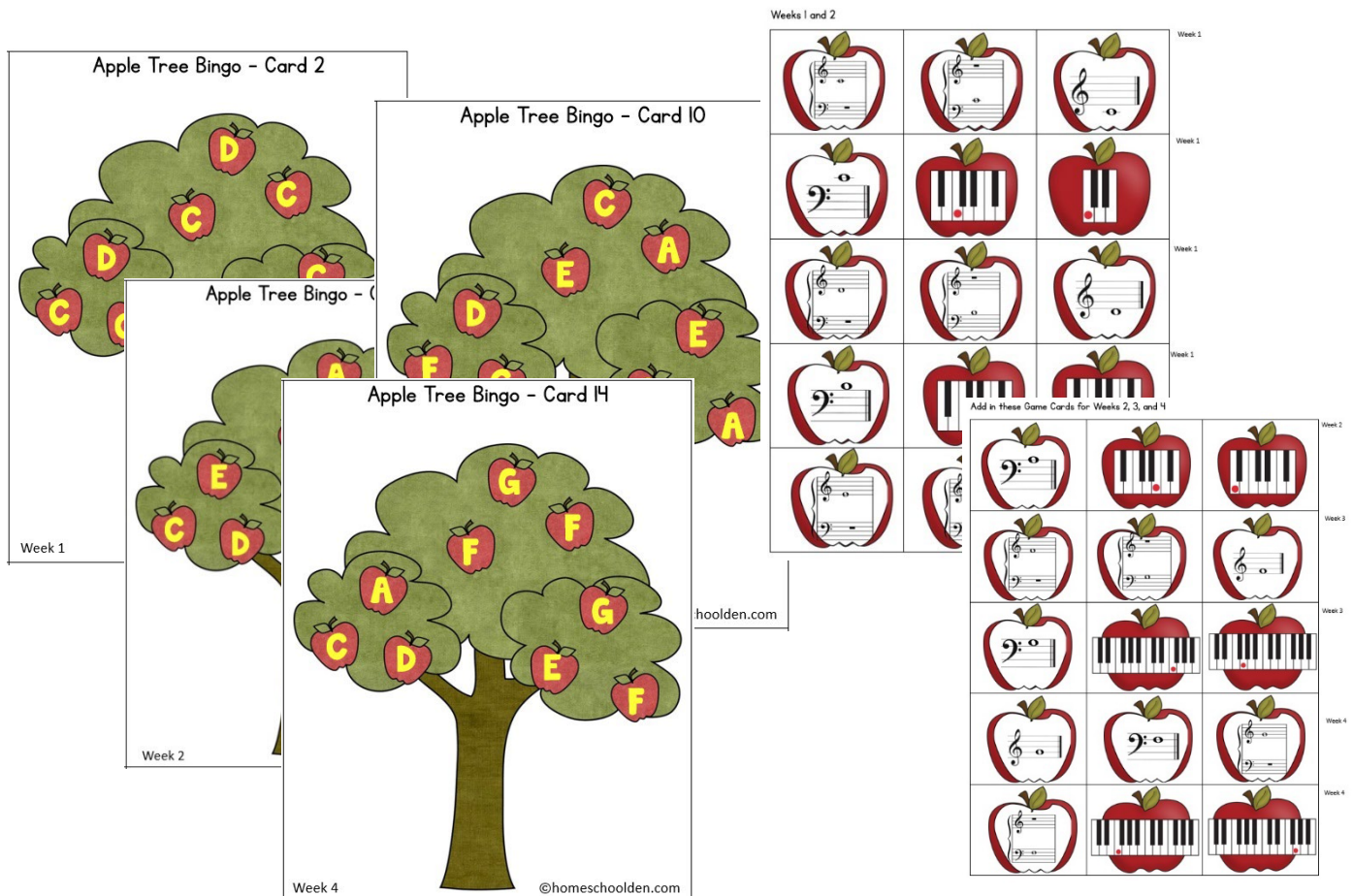
Print out the Apple Bingo Cards for the week you want to play on card stock.

Each player needs tokens to cover their bingo card.

Print out the bingo cards needed (see weeks below). You might want to print out two copies of the cards (and use the weeks indicated).

- Week 1 Bingo - you need the Week 1 rows
- Week 2 Bingo - You need the rows for Weeks 1 and 2
- Week 3 Bingo - You need the rows for Weeks 1, 2 and 3
- Week 4 Bingo - You need the rows for Weeks 1, 2, 3, and 4

Shuffle the apple bingo cards and place them face down in a pile. One player picks up a card and identifies the note. Everyone covers one of the letters on their apple tree. Then the next player picks up a card and identifies the note. Again, everyone covers one of the letters on their apple tree. The first person to cover all of their apples calls out "BINGO" and wins the round!

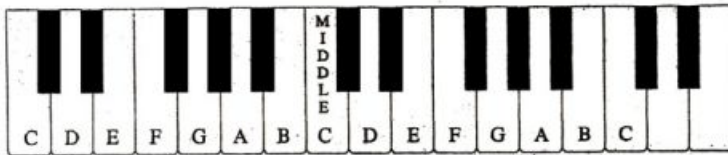

Print out the fishbowls and fish cards on cardstock.

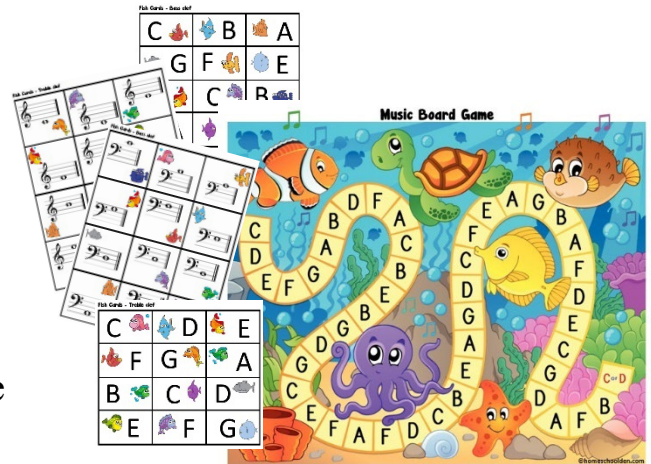
Cut out the fish cards and place a paper clip on each card.



Make a “fishing rod” with a piece of string with a magnet at the end. Have students “catch” a fish, identify the note and then place it onto the fishing mat.

Fish Board Game

Print the fish cards out on card stock. Cut them out, shuffle and place them face down. Print out the game board. Players take turns drawing a card and moving to the next space with that letter. The player that makes it to the end by drawing a C or D card wins the game!



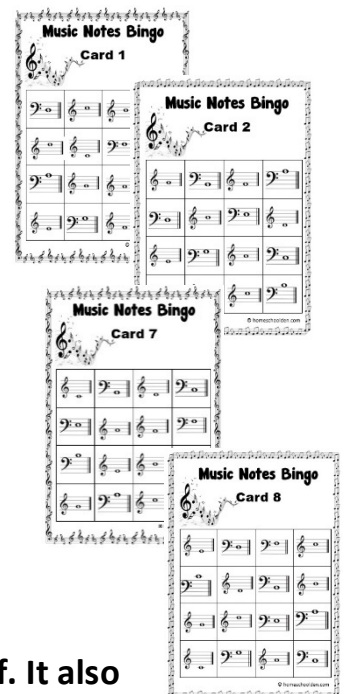
Fish Music Note Bingo!



Print out both the treble clef and bass clef fish cards on cardstock. Cut them out and place them face down (but do not include the high E, F or G in the treble clef cards or the low A, G or F bass clef cards).

Each player gets a bingo card. Players take turns turning over a card, identifying it and covering that note (if they have it) with a token. The first person to get four in a row (or a full card) wins the round.

Note: The bingo game does not include high E, F or G in the treble clef. It also does not include low base clef A, G or F.
