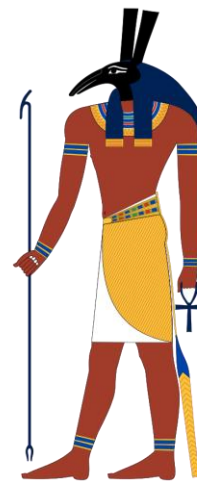

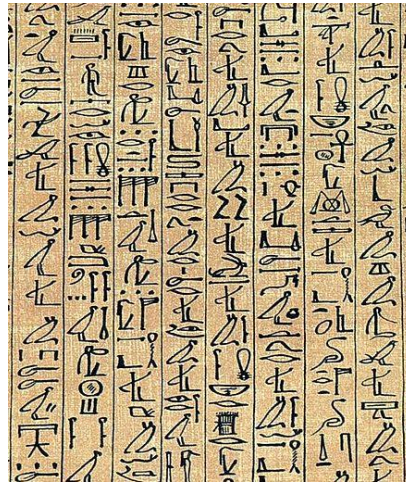

First Mummy

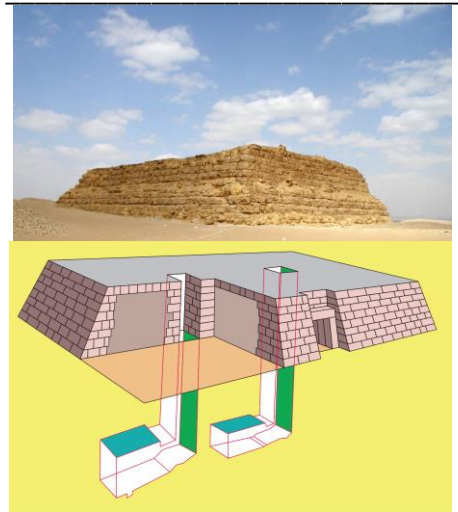
The god of mummification, Anubis, prepares the first mummy. The mummy represents both Osiris and the deceased who becomes Osiris in the afterlife.



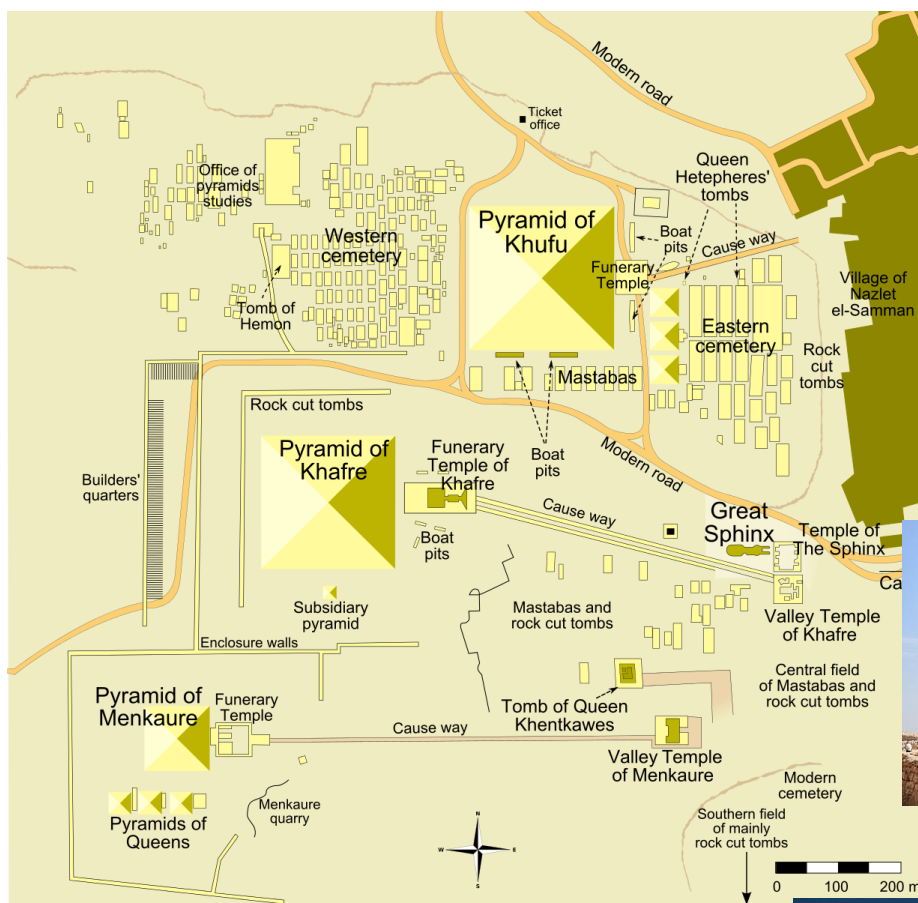

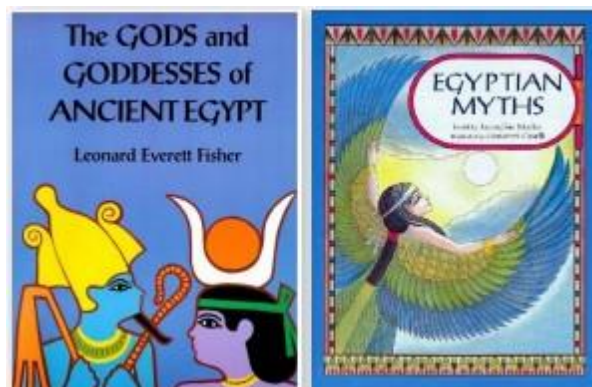

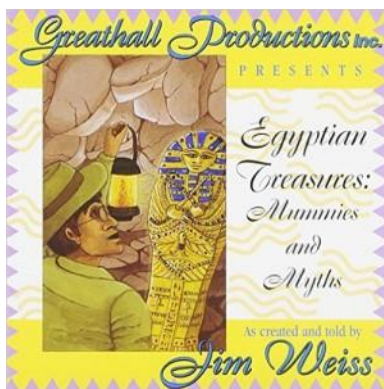


Egyptian Myths:

A couple of years ago we studied Egyptian mythology in more depth. We started with a book that has simple, short explanations of the Egyptian gods and goddesses ([The Gods and Goddesses of Ancient Egypt](#) by Leonard Fisher). Then we read the wonderful, well written [Egyptian Myths](#) book (edited by Jacqueline Morley).



We also listened to a CD about Ancient Egypt's mummies and myths. It is called [Egyptian Treasures: Mummies and Myths](#) (*affiliate link*), done by Jim Weiss. Between these stories and the Egyptian Myth book above, the kids really have a wonderful understanding of some of Ancient Egypt's gods and goddesses.
