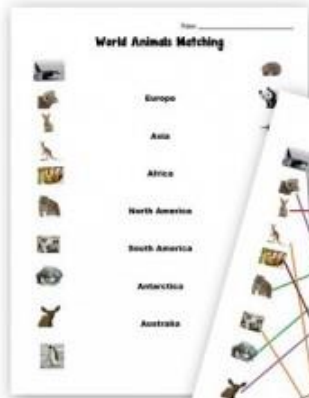

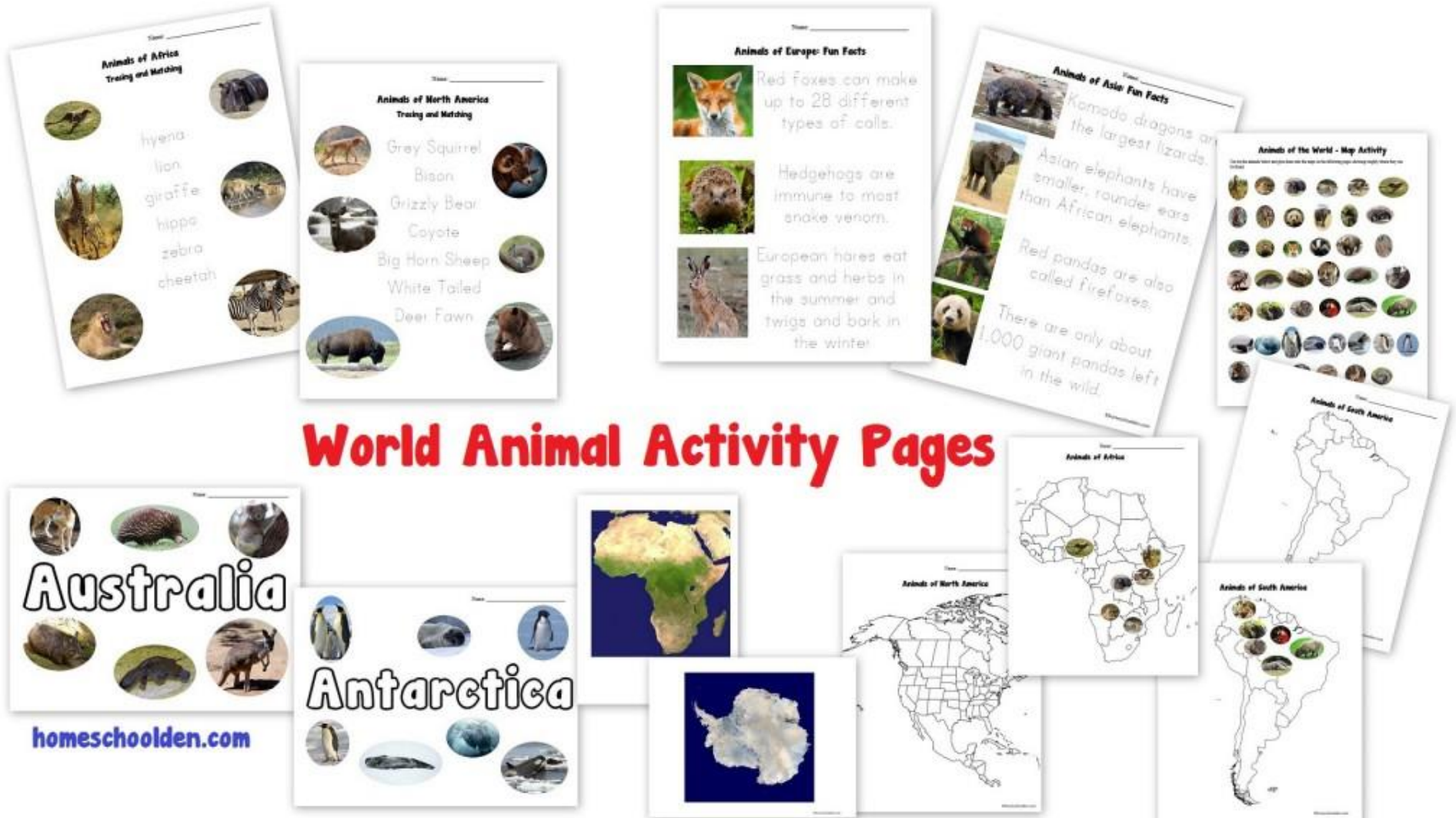

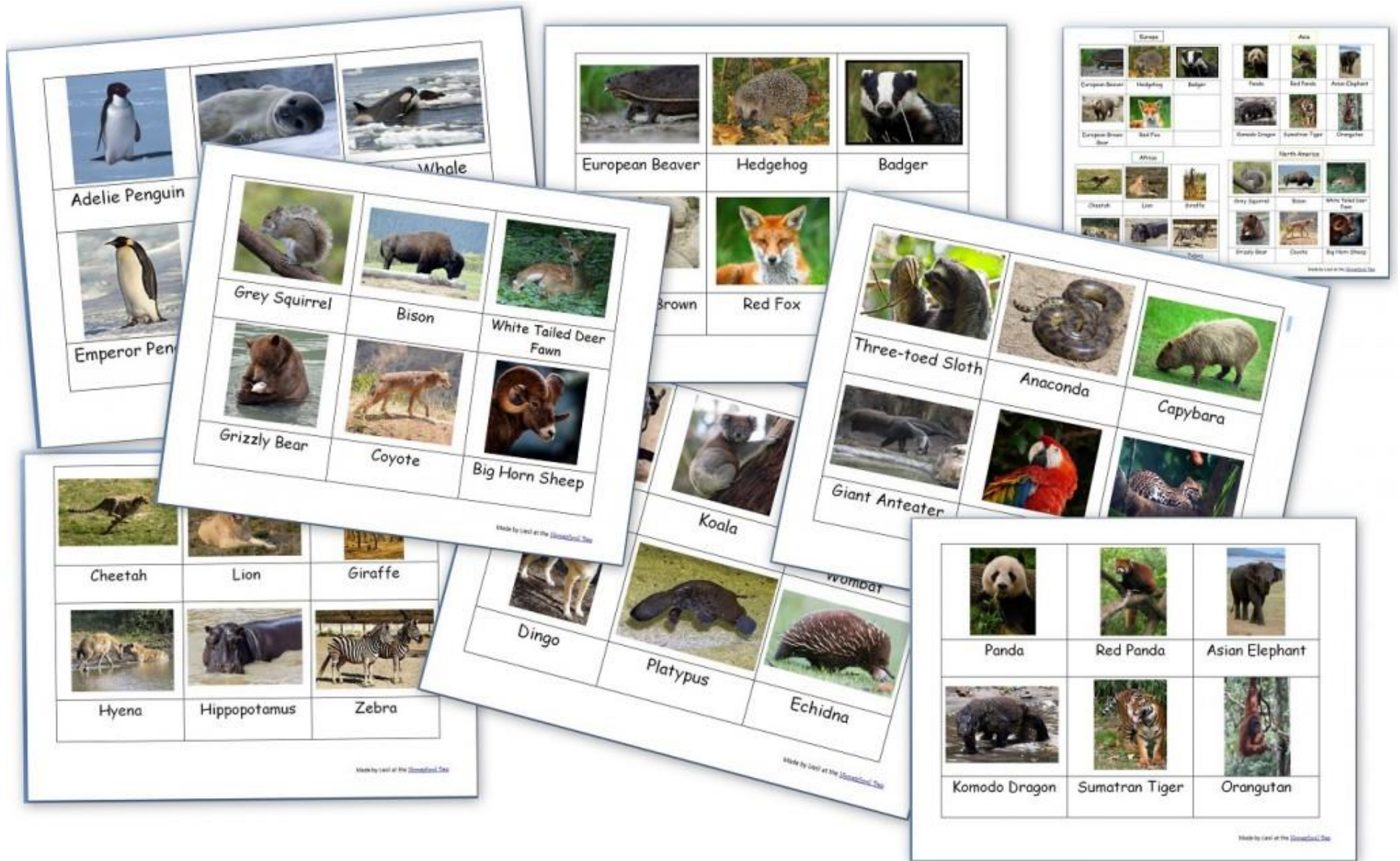

How to Use Montessori 3-Part Cards: In addition to the Montessori 3-part cards, there are instructions on how we used those cards and the song we sang:

How we used the World Animal Montessori Cards:

I wanted to include a description of how we used these World Animal cards when my daughter was in preschool. At the time, we did a whole unit on animals. She looked closely at the vertebrate-invertebrate groups and we talked a lot about the characteristics of the animals of the 5 vertebrate groups.

This is an activity we did about the animals of the 7 continents.



This was a time when ED was working on her world geography. She spent a couple of weeks going over the 7 continents, and working with some Montessori 3-part cards I made for her.

As she sang the 7-continents song, she looked at the animal cards for each continent and placed them on the proper continent. She did this with a large world map we have:



You can see our 7 Continents Song you-tube video over at this post... the kids use the song to help someone (overseas) learn the tune.

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Another day, she identified and set out the satellite photos we have of the continents. (We sang through the song (see p. 10) and she picked out each satellite image.)



Once she was pretty familiar with the animals on each continent, I brought out the Montessori 3-part cards. I printed out two sets of each and cut out the animals and word labels. She had to match them to the picture.

At the end of the week, I challenged her to match the word to the picture (without the control card)!

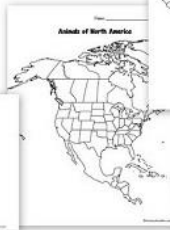
